

Fun With Crayons

JOIN ROSE HUGHES

Open new doors for designing your own fabric. You will learn how to take simple crayons and fabric paints to create exciting fabric opportunities.

CLASS DESCRIPTION: Yes, crayons and paint! This technique is not only easy but fun as well! By using simple materials that we may already have around the home and incorporating some of the basic elements of design and color theory we will spend the classtime painting our way to new fabrics. Go home with wonderful fabrics to be used in your next quilt and the know how to keep on painting.

SUPPLIES:

- ❑ Drawing Materials: Pencil, Eraser, Drawing or Tracing Paper, Quilt Ruler
- ❑ Linoleum Cutting tools & small 3x3 rubber carving block
(Speedball brand found in art stores-print making section recommended)



- ❑ Various rubber stamps that you may have
- ❑ Textured-nubby items (examples: sand paper; corrugated cardboard (sleeves from specialty coffees work great)
- ❑ Box of Crayons (the more the better, glitter, metallic or pearl crayons work, too!)
- ❑ (4) 14" squares of bleached 100% cotton muslin pre-washed and ironed (no starch)
- ❑ Clover Quilt Marking tool (white plastic tool that presses a line into the fabric)
- ❑ Wax Paper
- ❑ Paper Towels
- ❑ Masking tape
- ❑ Paint Brushes of various sizes and other painting tools
(Bring items that you may have around your home to experiment; at a minimum you may use kitchen sponges & Qtips)
- ❑ Ice cube tray and small recycled plastic bowls (for palette)
- ❑ Iron/Ironing board

***Note: There is a \$10 supply fee covering Createx Airbrush Paints in various colors and types (transparent, opaque, pearlized and iridescent) for classroom use.**
